#### **DAY 1: PARIS**

- Bienvenue en France! Upon arrival in Paris, meet your Forum Tour Manager, <u>Cindy</u>, a Parisian native.
- Before starting your adventure, Cindy will give you a copy of this 'cheat sheet' by Cheatography, with useful French phrases to help you navigate your way through the City of Light!
- In the morning, take a <u>virtual tour</u> of the **Musée du Louvre**, the world's largest art museum. Its famous collection of art and antiquities includes the *Mona Lisa* and 35,000 other works of art on display in 300 rooms.
- In the afternoon, board a bateau mouche (riverboat) for an unforgettable cruise on the Seine River. Practice your comprehension skills while on board with these <u>listening exercises</u> by TV5Monde.
- Afterward, climb the <u>virtual steps</u> to reach the Sacré-Cœur, Montmartre's hilltop church, and enjoy a 360° tour of the famous landmark.
- Listen to <u>La Bohème</u> by Charles Aznavour and discover the Bohemian lifestyle of the artists of Montmartre!
- Spend the evening immersed in the funny and chaotic world of <u>Little</u>
   <u>Nicholas</u> and his school friends.

## DAY 2: PARIS | GIVERNY | ROUEN

- Start your day with a French treat by preparing your own <u>Pain Perdu</u> (from A Spicy Perspective), also known as French toast!
- Next visit the blooming gardens of <u>Claude Monet's home</u> in Giverny, the inspiration for many of his famous paintings.
- If you are artistically inclined, **color** in the lines of Monet's famous painting, *Le déjeuner*, with Dessine moi une histoire.
- In the afternoon, visit Rouen to discover the legacy of the French heroine
   <u>Joan of Arc</u>, who, at just 19 years old, led numerous battles against the
   English during the Hundred Years' War before being captured and burned
   at the stake in Rouen (It's History).

## **DAY 3: ARROMANCHES | D-DAY BEACHES**


- Visit the site of the **D-Day landings**. Did you know the beaches are named after the code names they were given during Operation Neptune on June 6<sup>th</sup>, 1944?
- Listen to this <u>podcast</u> by Chris Hattingh to learn more about "le débarquement."
- Then, read "10 things you might not know about the Normandy invasion" (Keiligh Baker, BBC News, 5 June 2019).
- In the evening, watch episode six of Netflix's "Greatest Events of WWII
  in Color" to see colorized footage of the day's historic events.











# **DAY 5: MONT ST-MICHEL | ST-MALO**

- After breakfast, enjoy spectacular views of the 1000-year-old <u>Abbey of Mont Saint-Michel</u> filmed with a drone (Wanaii films). Built atop a rock island where the powerful tides crash onto the sandbanks between Normandy and Brittany, this masterpiece of medieval architecture is one of the most unforgettable sights in Europe.
- In the afternoon, why not bake a <u>French apple tart</u> following The Kitchn's recipe?
- Later head in the direction of **Brittany**, a region full of surprises! First, stop in **Saint-Malo**, a town famous for its <u>seafood</u>. Watch this <u>video</u> and complete the exercises after (TV5Monde).
- When you find a calm moment, listen to Yann Tiersen's <u>Comptine d'un</u>
   <u>autre été</u>, composed by the Breton musician for the movie <u>Le Fabuleux</u>
   <u>Destin D'Amélie Poulain</u>

#### **DAY 6: ST-MALO**

- Start your morning preparing some delicious <u>crêpes</u> (by Delish), an easy recipe that will make the whole family happy. Did you know crêpes originally come from Brittany?!
- Test your knowledge of French cuisine (Matador Network). Then, brush up on your culinary vocabulary with this other <u>food quiz</u> (Lawless French).
- Did you know that Brittany belongs to one of the **Celtic nations**? Along with Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Cornwall and Isle of Man, Brittany held off a complete invasion by the Romans when they reached other parts of continental Europe. Watch this <u>video</u> to hear **Breton Celtic music** and see some of Brittany's most emblematic places (Mathieu Maxime Prod).
- Listen to this <u>playlist</u> if you enjoy Celtic tunes in the Breton language, part of the Celtic language family that includes Gaelic, Welsh and Cornish (Feel Da Viken).

#### **DAY 7: PARIS**

- After breakfast, head back to Paris and enjoy a quick, final <u>virtual tour</u> to capture your last impressions of the French capital (You Visit).
- Later, check out some of the <u>French stereotypes</u> (clichés) and see if you fit any of them (Courrier International). Are you French at heart?
- If you find some time for coloring, why not color this lovely <u>image</u> of the famous French rat *Ratatouille* admiring the Eiffel Tower (Supercoloring)?
   Or maybe this authentic <u>Parisian café</u> (Melissa Colson)?
- In the evening board your flight home and watch "Astérix and Obélix:

  God save Britannia," narrating one of the many adventures of the famous duo from Gaul and their lifelong resistance to the Roman invasion.
